

Summary of Operator's Rules for EuroMillions Lottery

EuroMillions is a Lottery game in which players from various European countries join in the fun of a co-ordinated game to win huge life changing jackpots. You pick five numbers (from 1 to 50) and two Lucky Star numbers (from 1 to 12). Each draw, five random numbers (from the 50 main numbers) and two random Lucky Star numbers (from 1 to 12) are drawn.

The minimum jackpot is €17 million and rolls-up from there if the jackpot is not won.

Draws take place twice per week on Tuesdays and Friday in Europe.

No more than one prize for play in any one drawing

The holder of a winning ticket can win only one prize category per single game in any one drawing but shall be paid the highest prize won.

Taxes

Matching EuroMillions tickets are purchased in Austria. Lottery winnings are not currently taxed in Austria.

Promotional Prizes

Some promotional prizes that may be offered by the Lottery Operator to ticket holders within the Lottery Operator's country are excluded from the prizes that can be won by The Lottery Office Players. The Divisional prizes listed above are the valid prizes offered by The Lottery Office.

Jackpot Cap

There is a jackpot cap of €200 Million that will increase up to a maximum of €250 million. Once the €200 million jackpot is won, the cap for the next cycle will be increased by €10 million to €210 million.

The same mechanism will be applied up until the jackpot reaches €250 million (the maximum cap).
